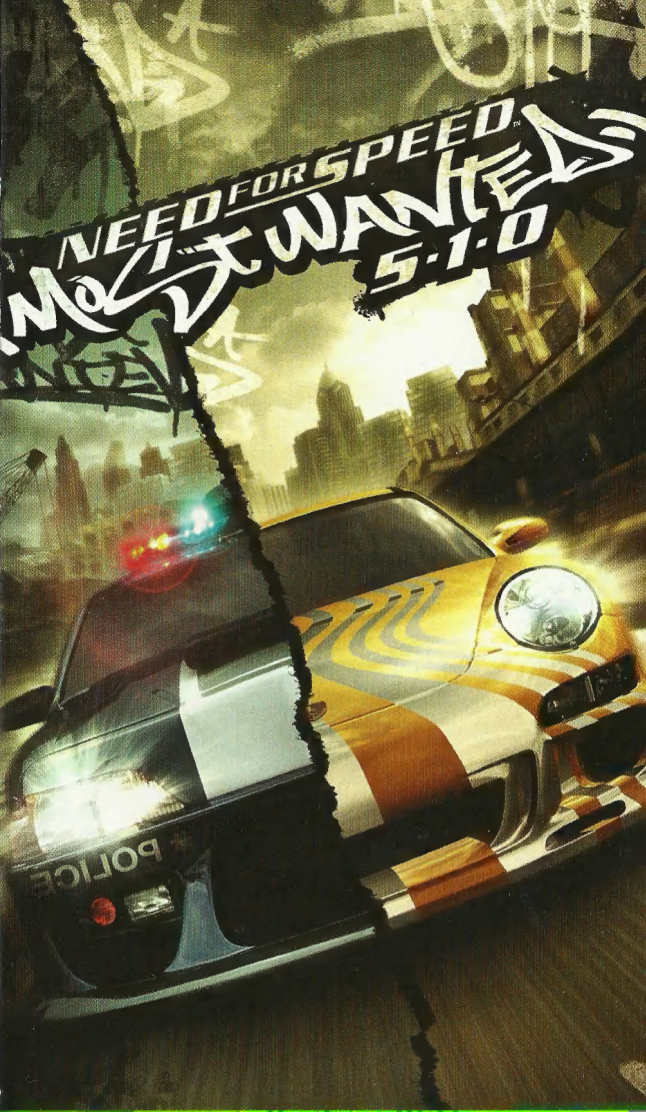




For safe use of this product, carefully read the following section of this manual and the Precautions section of the instruction manual supplied with the PSP handheld entertainment system before use. Retain both this software manual and the instruction manual for future reference.

Health precautions

- When operating the unit, play in a well-lit room and keep a safe distance from the screen.
- Avoid prolonged use of the system. Take a break of about 15 minutes during every hour of play.
- Do not use the system when you are tired or short of sleep.
- When using headphones, do not turn the volume up before putting the headphones on. Also, do not listen at loud volume levels for extended periods of time. Stop using the system immediately if you experience any of the following symptoms. If the condition persists, consult a doctor.
- Lightheadedness, nausea, or a sensation similar to motion sickness.
- Discomfort or pain in the eyes, ears, hands, arms, or any other part of the body.

Use and handling precautions

- This disc is PSP format software and is intended for use with the PSP handheld entertainment system only. If the disc is used with other devices, damage to the disc or to the device may result.
- Depending on the software, a Memory Stick Duo™ or Memory Stick PRO Duo™ (both sold separately) may be required. Refer to the software manual for full details.
- Do not use while driving or walking. Do not use in airplanes or medical facilities where use is prohibited or restricted.
- Set the PSP handheld system's wireless network feature to off when using the PSP on trains or in other crowded locations. If used near persons with pacemakers, the signal from the PSP handheld system's wireless network feature could interfere with the proper operation of the pacemaker.
- If paused images are displayed on the screen for an extended period of time, a faint image may be left permanently on the screen.
- Store the disc in its case when not in use and keep in a place out of the reach of children. If the disc is left out this may result in warping or other damage to the disc.
- Do not leave the disc in direct sunlight, near a heat source, in a car or other places subject to high heat and humidity.
- Do not touch the opening on the rear of the disc (recording surface of the disc; see drawing). Do not allow dust, sand, foreign objects or other types of dirt to get on the disc.
- Do not block the opening with paper or tape. Also, do not write on the disc.
- If the opening area does get dirty, wipe gently with a soft cloth.
- To clean the disc, wipe the exterior surface gently with a soft cloth.
- Do not use solvents such as benzine, commercially-available cleaners not intended for CDs, or anti-static spray intended for vinyl LPs as these may damage the disc.
- Do not use cracked or deformed discs or discs that have been repaired with adhesives as these may cause system damage or malfunction.
- SCEA will not be held liable for damage resulting from the misuse of discs.

Ejecting the disc

Press the right side of the disc until it is in the position shown in the drawing and then remove it. If excess force is applied this may result in damage to the disc.



Storing the disc

Insert the bottom side of the disc and then press on the top side until it clicks into place. If the disc is not stored properly, this may result in damage to the disc.

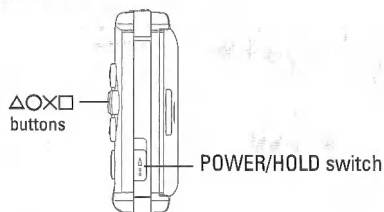
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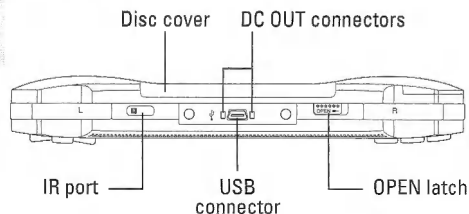

Getting Started

Set up your PSP™ (PlayStation® Portable) system according to the instructions in the manual supplied with the system. Turn the system on. The power indicator lights up in green and the home menu is displayed. Press the OPEN latch to open the disc cover. Insert the *Need for Speed™ Most Wanted 5-1-0* disc with the label facing away from the system, slide until fully inserted and close the disc cover. From the PSP™ system's home menu, select the Game icon and then the UMD icon. A thumbnail for the software is displayed. Select the thumbnail and press the **×** button of the PSP™ to start the software. Follow the on-screen instructions and refer to this manual for information on using the software.

Notice: Do not eject a UMD while it is playing.

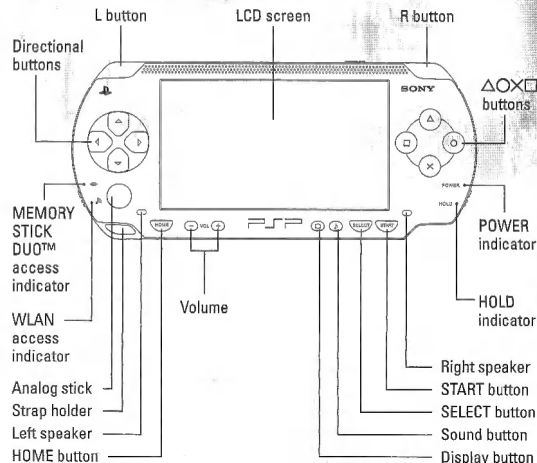
Memory Stick Duo™

Warning! Keep Memory Stick Duo media out of reach of small children, as the media could be swallowed by accident.

To save game settings and progress, insert a Memory Stick Duo into the memory stick slot of your PSP. You can load saved game data from the same memory stick or any Memory Stick Duo containing previously saved games.

Starting the Game

Your Profile

Before you can advance to the Main menu, you must first create a profile and buy a car.

To create a profile:

1. Select **PLAYER 1** and enter your profile name, then select **ENTER**.
2. Use the D-buttons to select your correct age.
3. Enter the name of your hometown and select **ENTER** again.
4. When you are finished, select **DONE**. The Car Select screen appears.

You begin with \$22,000 in cash with which you can buy one of three vehicles. Toggle between the three cars to review their top speed, handling, and acceleration stats.

- To buy a car, select it and press the **X** button. The Main menu appears.

Main Menu

QUICK PLAY

Launch into quick one-time races behind the wheel of one of the cars in your Safehouse (see p. 6).

CAREER

Complete a series of races to earn respect, prove your skills, and become the Most Wanted (see p. 6).

MULTIPLAYER

Race against a friend via an Ad Hoc or Infrastructure mode connection.

MY PROFILE

Change your options or access your Game Data.

SAFEHOUSE

View and modify the cars you own, or buy a new car. Press the **I** button to access your Safehouse from the Main menu (see p. 8).

EA™ POCKET TRAX

Customize the game's soundtrack.

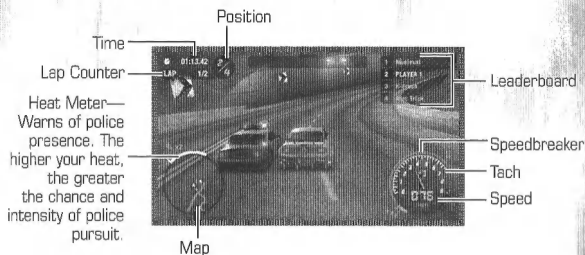

Playing the Game

Slide into the driver's seat. With a variety of events, tracks, and modes to choose from, the race to become the Most Wanted racer is at your fingertips.

Bust Evasion

When you're aiming to become the Most Wanted racer, the heat is always on. Elude the cops with a suped up ride and a lot of fancy pedal work. But what happens if you can't shake a police pursuit? Here are some pointers.

- **Out-drive the cops**—It's a no-brainer, but it works. Drive faster and ride harder to keep the police constantly eating your exhaust.
- **Take a shortcut**—The police can't pursue you when they can't find you.
- **Ram the police car into traffic**—Can't shake your tail? Give him something bigger to worry about.

Doubling Down

If you win a Career race with a full Heat Meter, you may be offered the chance to double down. When doubling down, you are challenged to outrun the police. Win and you are awarded double the cash prize and bonus respect points. Fail to outrun the cops in the time allowed and you lose it all.

- When **DOUBLE DOWN** appears on-screen, select **YES** to begin the outrun challenge.

Note: Doubling down does not affect your career progression, accumulated cash, or current respect points earned before the race.

Saving and Loading

Note: Your progress is autosaved each time you win a race or apply upgrades to your car if you have the autosave featured enabled in your profile.

- To load a game you must first create a profile. After you create your profile, the game autoloads every time you start *Need for Speed Most Wanted 5-1-0*.

Game Modes

Quick Play

To start a Quick Play game, select QUICK PLAY in the Main menu. Choose between an INSTANT RACE, CUSTOM RACE, OUTFRAN game, or TUNER TAKEDOWN mode.

Instant Race

Jump right into the action. The type of race, location and a 'suped up car are randomly chosen for you.

- To start an Instant Race, select INSTANT RACE in the Quick Play menu. A prompt appears asking if you're ready to race. Press the **X** button to confirm.

Custom Race

Choose a location then start your engine.

- To start a Custom Race, select CUSTOM RACE in the Quick Play menu. Select a track you wish to race on then press the **X** button.

Outrun

Evade the police in an intense pursuit race. If you can get enough distance ahead of the cops, you win.

- To start an Outrun race, select OUTFRAN in the Quick Play menu. Select a track you wish to race on then press the **X** button.

Tuner Takedown

You're the cop in this brand-new mode that pits you against the Most Wanted street racers in an attempt to take 'em down.

- To start a game in Tuner Takedown mode, select TUNER TAKEDOWN in the Quick Play menu, then select a pursuit vehicle and press the **X** button. The race begins.

Career

The race is on to see who can become the Most Wanted. Win races, climb the Black List, and display some fancy pedal work in order to shake the cops. You might earn a reputation as the most notorious racer.

- To start a new Career, select CAREER in the Main menu.
- To climb the Black List, win events, then beat the boss at each Black List level.

Multiplayer Mode

WI-FI (WLAN) Features

Software titles that support Wi-Fi functionality allow you to communicate with other PSP systems and compete against other players via a connection to a wireless local area network (WLAN). You can adjust the network settings to allow connection to a wireless local area network (WLAN). There are two WLAN modes, Ad Hoc mode and Infrastructure mode.

Ad Hoc Mode

Ad Hoc mode is a Wi-Fi feature that allows two or more individual PSP systems to communicate directly with each other.

- To start a game in Ad Hoc mode, select AD HOC in the Multiplayer menu. The Ad Hoc screen—with its list of game names—appears. Select a game and press the **X** button.
- To create a new Ad Hoc game, select AD HOC in the Multiplayer menu, then press the **□** button. The Create Game screen appears. Specify game options, then select DONE. Your game is created. Each player selects READY. Once all of the players in the Ad Hoc screen that wish to play your game are ready, select START GAME. Each player selects a car and presses the **X** button. When all players have chosen their cars, the game starts.

Infrastructure Mode

Infrastructure mode is a Wi-Fi feature that allows the PSP system to link to a network via a WLAN access point (a device used to connect to a wireless network). In order to access Infrastructure mode features, several additional items are required, including a subscription to an Internet service provider, a network device, a WLAN access point, and a PC. For further information and set up details, please refer to the PSP system's Instruction Manual.

- To start a game in Infrastructure mode, select INFRASTRUCTURE in the Multiplayer menu. The EA Nation logo appears. Select a network connection or create a new one by selecting NEW CONNECTION and following the on-screen instructions. Create a new EA Online Account or use an existing Account, then select or create your Persona. The Infrastructure menu appears.

A quick search to find opponents.

LOBBY

Create or join a game.

LEADERBOARDS

View the Top 100 or the best lap records.

MY PROFILE

Adjust your online settings.

Playing behind a firewall

It is recommended that you do not play behind a firewall. However, if you wish to do so, you must open up the following port: 3658 (peer to peer connection).

Hint: A WLAN access point is a device used to connect to a wireless network. SSID and WEP keys are types of wireless network information. They may be required when connecting to an access point or a router. This information is generally set in the access point or router using a PC.

Safehouse

Here you can upgrade the look and performance of your rides or buy new cars.

Visual Upgrades

Apply a few creative touches to the look of your ride with a variety of kits, rims, and paint jobs. As you progress through Career mode, you unlock better kits. With the cash you've earned by winning events, you can add a lot of flash to your ride.

To upgrade a car:

1. When in the Safehouse, select a car that you own and wish to modify.
2. Press the **L** button to enter the SHOP.
3. Select VISUAL UPGRADES.
4. Press the D-button left/right to scroll through available Body Kit, Spoiler, Hood, Vinyls, Rims, Tint, and Paint upgrades.
5. Press the D-button up/down to scroll through the available visual items (be sure you have enough cash) and press the **X** button. Your car is upgraded.

Performance Upgrades

Start with your stock vehicle and add a variety of performance modifications. By spending the cash you earn in Career events, you can improve the performance of your ride. As you win events, you unlock better quality parts. You may even gain access to bonus parts if you can earn enough respect.

To upgrade a car:

1. When in the Safehouse, select a car that you own and wish to modify.
2. Press the **L** button to enter the SHOP.
3. Select PERFORMANCE UPGRADES.
4. Press the D-button left/right to scroll through available Handling, Engine, Induction, Chassis, and Nitrous upgrades.
5. Press the D-button up/down to scroll through the available performance items (be sure you have enough cash) and press the **X** button. Your car is upgraded.

Buy a Car

Sometimes the optimal combination of speed and beauty requires you to pick up something newer and faster. Are you ready to take the plunge on a new ride?

To buy a new car:

1. In the Safehouse, press the D-button left/right to scroll through available cars.
2. Press the **X** button on a car you do not already own.
3. If you have enough cash, the car is purchased and the price is deducted from your cash.
